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Continuing Disclosure Requirements - A Continuing Saga

Most municipal securities market participants have become familiar with the SEC Rule 15c2-12 amendments, promulgated in 1994 (the 1994 Amendments), that require participating underwriters to reasonably determine that the issuer (or the obligated person) has made a written commitment (typically in the form of a continuing disclosure certificate or agreement) to provide "continuing disclosure" in connection with non-exempt issues of municipal securities sold on or after July 3, 1995. 1

In 2008, the SEC announced several new amendments to the Rule effective July 1, 2009 (the 2009 Amendments), some of which affect only continuing disclosure commitments that are to be made with respect to municipal securities sold on or after July 1, 2009, and others of which also affect the commitments made with respect to municipal securities sold on or after July 3, 1995 and before July 1, 2009.

BACKGROUND - CONTINUING DISCLOSURE UNDER THE 1994 AMENDMENTS

The 1994 Amendments required underwriters to obtain different types of commitments from "large" issuers and obligated persons (generally, those with more than \$10 million of outstanding securities at the time they issue the securities with respect to which the commitment is made) and "small" issuers and obligated persons (the rest). Large issuers were to commit to make annual financial information and operating data and material event filings with nationally recognized municipal information repositories (NRMSIRs) and any state information depository (the SID - in the case of Ohio issuers, OMAC), while small issuers were to make a more limited commitment to make material event filings with the NRMSIRs or the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (the MSRB) and the SID and to provide annual information and operating data that was customarily prepared and publicly available either to any person, upon request, or to the SID. OMAC has historically encouraged small issuers (and obligated persons) to file their annual information and operating data with OMAC (rather than to simply make it available on request).

¹ Issues meeting one of the following descriptions are exempt from the Rule's continuing disclosure requirements: (1) issues under \$1 million and (2) issues over \$1 million but in denominations of \$100,000 or more and for which there are 35 or fewer buyers or for which the maturity is nine months or less. Issues with maximum maturities of 18 months or less are exempt from the requirement to provide annual information and operating data but are not exempt from the requirement to provide material events notices.

EFFECT OF 2009 AMENDMENTS AND RELATED DEVELOPMENTS

FOR ISSUES SOLD ON OR AFTER JULY 3, 1995 AND PRIOR TO JULY 1, 2009

Generally, the continuing disclosure commitments of all Ohio issuers and obligated persons with respect to municipal securities sold on or after July 3, 1995 and before July 1, 2009 will remain in effect until those securities are retired; however, the 2009 Amendments and related developments will affect those continuing disclosure commitments as follows:

As to Commitments of Large Issuers and Other Obligated Persons:

- The SEC has reduced the number of NRMSIRs from four to one and named the MSRB to be the sole NRMSIR. Thus, the filings of annual financial information and operating data in the nature of that included in the final official statement in connection with the primary offering of the securities (including filings of audited financial statements) and filings of material event and other required notices of large Ohio issuers and obligated persons are now to be made only with the MSRB and OMAC.
- The MSRB has created an Electronic Municipal Market Access (EMMA) system and is accepting required continuing disclosure filings and notices only through that system in an electronic format and with accompanying identifying information prescribed by the MSRB. (See the discussion below under EMMA System Filings.)
- OMAC and the MSRB have agreed that electronic copies of all filings made by Ohio issuers and obligated parties on the EMMA system will be made available to OMAC on the date of filing. Accordingly, OMAC has requested issuers and obligated parties (or their disclosure counsel or agent on their behalf) to accomplish their filings with OMAC, including filings of their audited annual financial statements and other annual disclosure information for the fiscal years ending on or after June 30, 2009, by filing the documents through the MSRB's EMMA system at www.emma.msrb.org rather than by mail or e-mail at the prior addresses OMAC provided for that purpose.
- The issuers and obligated persons may obtain receipts for their filings through the EMMA system, and OMAC has advised that, until further notice, it will also deem those receipts as evidence that the filings have been made with OMAC.

As to Commitments of Small Ohio Issuers and Other Obligated Persons:

• With respect to annual information and operating data customarily prepared and publicly available, small issuers and obligated persons may, as specified in their commitments with respect to issues sold before July 1, 2009, either (i) file the information and operating data with OMAC or (ii) make it available to any person on request. (OMAC is continuing to encourage small issuers and obligated persons to make annual filings of information and operating data with OMAC.)
Small issuers and obligated persons are not required to file the information and operating data with the MSRB with respect to issues sold before July 1,

2009.

- With respect to material event and other notices, the SEC has reduced the number of NRMSIRs from four to one and named the MSRB to be the sole NRMSIR. Thus, filings of material event and other required notices of small Ohio issuers and obligated persons are now to be made only with the MSRB and OMAC.
- The MSRB has created an Electronic Municipal Market Access (EMMA) system and is accepting filings of notices only through that system in an electronic format and with accompanying identifying information prescribed by the MSRB. (See the discussion below under EMMA System Filings.)
- OMAC has requested issuers and obligated parties (or their disclosure counsels
 or agents on their behalf) accomplish their filings with OMAC, including the filing
 of annual information and operating data for the fiscal years ending on or after
 June 30, 2009, by filing the documents through the EMMA system at www.emma.
 msrb.org rather than by mail or e-mail at the prior addresses OMAC provided for
 that purpose. However, OMAC will continue to accept paper filings or direct e-mail
 filings at those prior addresses from issuers and obligated parties who choose not
 to file electronically.
- The issuers and obligated parties may obtain receipts for their electronic filings through the EMMA system, and OMAC has advised that, until further notice, it will also deem those receipts as evidence that the filings have been made with OMAC.

FOR ISSUES SOLD ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2009

The 2009 Amendments and related developments require continuing disclosure commitments with respect to municipal securities sold on or after July 1, 2009 as follows:

As to Commitments of Large Ohio Issuers and Other Obligated Persons:

- The continuing disclosure commitment must be to provide filings of annual financial information and operating data in the nature of that included in the final official statement in connection with the primary offering of the securities (including filings of audited financial statements) and material event and other required notices to the MSRB. The required annual information filings and notices are to be delivered to the MSRB only through its EMMA system in an electronic format and with accompanying identifying information prescribed by the MSRB. (See the discussion below under EMMA System Filings.)
- There is no longer a requirement that there be a commitment to make filings with a SID (such as OMAC); however, OMAC expects that the MSRB will continue to make available to OMAC electronic copies of all filings made by Ohio issuers and obligated persons on the EMMA system.

As to Commitments of Small Ohio Issuers and Other Obligated Persons:

 The continuing disclosure commitment must be to file annual information and operating data customarily prepared by the issuer or obligated person that is publicly available and material event and other required notices with the MSRB. The filings are to be delivered to the MSRB only through its EMMA system in an electronic format and with accompanying identifying information prescribed by the MSRB. (See the discussion below under EMMA System Filings.).

- There is no longer a requirement that there be a commitment to make such filings with a SID (such as OMAC); however, OMAC expects that it will continue to have access to electronic copies of all filings made by Ohio issuers and obligated persons on the EMMA system.
- In its Release concerning the 2009 Amendments, the SEC suggests that, if a small
 issuer or obligated person customarily prepares and makes publicly available
 information that is more extensive than what the issuer provides in the final official
 statement for its issue, the issuer or obligated person may undertake to provide
 only the information that would comprise annual information and operating data
 required to be filed by large issuers or obligated persons.

EMMA SYSTEM FILINGS

The MSRB's EMMA system is an Internet-based, centralized database that provides free public access to disclosure and transaction information about municipal bonds to issuers, other obligated persons, investors and other municipal market participants. The MSRB now accepts annual information filings and material event notices under continuing disclosure agreements only through the EMMA system. As contemplated by the 2009 Amendments, the MSRB has prescribed that all such filings and notices are to be submitted as PDF files that can be saved, viewed, printed and electronically retransmitted and that, with limited exceptions for diagrams, images and other non-textual elements, are "word-searchable."

The MSRB has also prescribed that with each document filed, the issuer or obligated person (or its disclosure counsel or agent) will be required to include the following identifying information: (i) the category of information being provided (i.e., any annual financial information, financial statements, operating data, material events notice or voluntary information); (ii) the period covered by information being filed; (iii) the issues or specific securities to which such document is related or otherwise material (including CUSIP number, issuer name, state, issue description/securities name, dated date, maturity date, and/or coupon rate); and (iv) contact information for the issuer or obligated person (or its disclosure counsel or agent) making the filling.

Filings are to be made through password-protected EMMA accounts. Issuers and obligated persons (and their disclosure counsel or other agents) may register through the EMMA Dataport online at www.emma.msrb.org. Once registered, a user ID and password will be assigned to the issuer or obligated person or agent representative.

EMMA will also accept other types of information on a voluntary basis from issuers. This includes voluntary quarterly reports, bondholder notices or other market communications. Additionally, issuers will be able (but not required) to submit prior annual disclosure reports and material event notices to provide historical financial information at one location. EMMA also provides access to official statements, advance refunding documents, real time and historical trade information, daily market information and other educational materials about municipal bonds.

Issuers and obligated persons should consult with their bond or disclosure counsel and disclosure agent to discuss in more detail the means by which they may meet the specific continuing disclosure commitments they have made in light of the newly effective amendments to Rule 15c2-12 and related developments.

ADDITIONAL AMENDMENTS PROPOSED BY THE SEC

Municipal market participants should also be aware that, in July 2009, the SEC requested comments on proposed additional amendments to Rule 15c2-12 (Rule). If adopted as proposed, those additional amendments would (i) require material event notices to be provided within 10 business days of the occurrence of the event (instead of simply "in a timely manner," as the Rule currently provides), (ii) require disclosure of certain events without regard to materiality, (iii) add to the list of events that must be disclosed and (iv) eliminate the exemption from the Rule for variable rate demand obligations.

The comment period closed on September 8, 2009, but the SEC has yet to announce its final action on the proposed amendments. **Any final amendments will not become effective until a final notice has been published by the SEC.** As proposed by the SEC, the proposed amendments would apply to municipal securities issued after the effective date of the amendments and to existing bonds that are remarketed in a "primary offering" under the Rule. However, the SEC specifically requested comments regarding the effective date and transition provisions.

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
